- This intellectual output works on innovation in teaching/learning strategies, and exchange of experiences/knowledge between different partners.
- To work on these outcomes, two Intensive Programmes for Study(IPS) has been organized.
- The specific outcomes of the IC were:
 - 1. have knowledge on vaccines and immunization;
 - 2. are able to consider ethical and cultural issues;
 - 3. have knowledge on evidence-based practice on vaccination;
 - 4. are aware of different vaccination schedules and are able to find the different schedules targeting different population target groups;
 - 5. are able to communicate and provide counselling to different populations by applying all the theoretical background knowledge obtained;
 - 6. are able to administer vaccinations to different populations in theory.











- New strategies of teaching has been experimented, including the exchanges and the confront between students and teachers coming from different countries.
- Participants were: 37 students (in in public health nursing, health visiting, public health specialists, nursing, midwifery), and 12 teachers for each partner university.
- Participant students will be selected considering: English skills and interest toward the proposed topic.
- The studies are carried out in a multicultural and international study group.
- The intensive course includes lectures, study visits, workshops, cultural programme, group work, simulations and teambuilding activities (all in English language).
- To each students ECTS will be recognized.



The evaluation included:

the participation of students during the class; the verbal feedback from the students during the course;

a reflecting diary filled up by students during the programme;

a questionnaire measuring the teachers and students' satisfaction;

Two monitoring teachers' meetings (middle and end program).









- The collected data gave a global positive evaluation with really good suggestions to improve the quality of the Moodle, and the next intensive course.
- The material produced by students, as course's tasks, were really good and creative. This means they could manage the difficult to work together in a multicultural and multidisciplinary group, talking in another language, and becoming a real team.
- All students felt they had gained good knowledge, and new perspective about the vaccination process.

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- A second intensive course, focused on simulations on the theme of vaccination, was planned in april 2020
- Due to the pandemic situation, it was not possible to realise it in VIC University (Spain)
- An on-line Intensive Course, involving students from the 5 universities, took palce from 15 to 19 march, in synchronous distance mode.









- VIC was the leading university of the event.
- The focus was on the theme of vaccination, with a special section about COVID- 19.



COVID-19 Global statistics of vaccination



•Average number of new infections reported each day in Kenya rises by more than **580** over the last 3 weeks, 52% of its previous peak.

Who's at the peak?

•We want to know where infections are trending up or down relative to the size of the outbreak in each country. So in these charts we use a rolling 7-day average of the new infections countries report each day and compare where that average is *now* to where it was at its *peak*.



The example of MMR vaccine...

In 1998 Andrew Wakefield realesed a paper claiming to have found a link between MMR vaccine and autism. In the coming years it has been proven that he had a financial conflict of interest.

In 2010, an ethics review board found that he had falsified the data in his report, causing an immediate retraction of his original paper and revocation of his medical license.











- 37 students from the 5 universities and 13 teachers
- General expected learning outcomes:
 - knowledge on vaccines and immunization;
 - consider ethical and cultural issues;
 - knowledge on evidence-based practice on vaccination;
 - knowledge of different vaccination schedules, and ability in finding different schedules targeting different population target groups;
 - communicate and provide counseling to different populations by applying all the theoretical background knowledge obtained;
 - administer vaccinations to different populations in theory;
 - Be more familiar with online learning.







- The used language was English
- The Online Intensive Course has been accredited with 2 ECTS (including a pre-assignment).
- This second Intensive Course has been conducted Online using Moodle and Zoom
- The work of the students was in multicultural groups, the goal was to prepare the final assignments of their groups. A teacher of each institution was responsible of one group of students.
- Team teaching was one of the teaching methods. The activities during the Online Intensive Course (5 days) included the following: lectures, case studies, discussions and presentations of students.







- Arguments of the Intensive Course:
 - Vaccination basics and procedure (self study):
 - Vaccination for refugees/immigrants;
 - Vaccine hesitancy and anti-vaccination groups;
 - Vaccinations for travellers;
 - COVID 19 pandemic and vaccines;
 - Intervention of a Representative of the Pan-Hellenic Association of Health Visitors as an example of vaccination programme for COVID 19.

Students in multicultural groups had the chance to work on the final assignements in separate zoom rooms.

The assignements were presented the last day to the whole group







Evaluation
